**Good Step#71 : Streets to School Project, Pragathi school operations – Kempapura**

In the fourth year of collaboration with Pragathi Charitable Trust, the **Streets to Schools** project is an effort to bring out-of-school slum children into mainstream education. This is done at two slum locations Kempapura, Hebbala and Sumanahalli.



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After having turned around these schools over the first two years of our operation, from being at a point of closing down to thriving and robust learning centres for these children, we now play a support role while Pragathi manages the day-to-day operations.

Children are taught basics of health and hygiene, civic sense, basic literacy and numeracy over a year and then guided and admitted into mainstream government schools.

This year **53 children were admitted to the Kempapura center** and introduced to education.

**Good Step # 74**

**MRVP camp at Hasiruvalli, Nelamangala on 27-May-2019 & 24-Jun-2019**

The Mobile Resource Vehicle Project in collaboration with Sankara Hospital operates an on-wheels fully equipped mobile eye-care unit that goes into poor communities and villages to perform on the spot diagnosis and treatment (for refractive errors). Patients who need surgeries are encouraged to undertake the hospital visit and provided surgical treatment for free with the contributions of our supporters.

This year we focused on Gram Panchayat (GP) s in Nelamangala Taluk of Bangalore Rural district covering 12 out of the 24 GPs in the taluka.

### Government High School Division, Peenya -Sewing machine unit

A tailoring training unit at GHS Peenya has been set-up from scratch to train students in this useful life skill. This request had come from the students themselves. Most of them come from impoverished backgrounds and are likely to drop out after 10th std. Initially 40+ girls and a few boys were initiated into the training and this was gradually scaled up to offer the opportunity to any interested student in this school of 800+ student strength.

### Good Step # 77

### GMPS Byadarahalli school water filter

This school Govt. Middle Primary School (GMPS) Byadarahalli faced an acute water problem due to the absence of a means to purify a local source of water. Consequently, the staff and older (6th and 7th std) students needed to fill and carry 20 cans of water daily from nearly a km away from the school to fulfil the water requirements of 749 students in the school. Installation of a RO unit within the school kitchen has solved their everyday struggle for a fundamental need of clean drinking water.



**Good Step # 78** GHS Rajavanthi e-shala

GHS Rajavanthi, is a remote school in Pavagada which is one of the most impoverished districts in Karnataka. The schools here are plagued by a lack of deputed school staff and poor academic performance.

Installation of solar powered e-shala (digital school curriculum) from this academic year, in this school, has sought to address the acute student need of ensuring that their instruction is good and most importantly uninterrupted.

We are grateful to our supporter Statkraft Solar solutions for recognizing and funding this initiative in such a far flung place to help out these kids! A group of volunteers from the organization also went out of their way and travelled the distance and interacted with the students in the school, which was an amazing experience for the students! The interaction has served to motivate and create aspiration among the students.



**Good Step # 79 Good School Project, GHPS Nelagedaranahalli classroom revamp**

**The Good School Project”** is our undertaking

- to develop essential infrastructure in govt schools (at least the bare minimum needed for the school to be a positive learning space for children)
- running programs to address poor academic performance.

This is the third year of operation of this project. Schools are identified in collaboration with the government education department of Karnataka as part of an MOU for the same. Specifically the following are the areas we seek to address through the contributions of our supporters.

**Educational Infrastructure**

- School building – repair/renovation  
Best undertaken through government education funds. Long and involved on account of various permissions and local factors involved. We will not undertake this
- Toilets  
Best undertaken through government Swaccha Bharat funds outlay.
- Classroom Infrastructure  
A basic functional classroom.
- Water  
A critical need in many schools on account of high flouride content. Can be fixed with purification systems. Vendors identified for the same
- Library/Educational Guides  
Will be put together as a combination of first hand and second hand books.
- Sports/Arts and Crafts Facilities  
Basic infrastructure needed for some extra-curricular activities. for students

**Educational Outcomes**

- Academic/Skill Building programs (English)  
Primarily English education programs focused on both curriculum requirements and spoken English development (as a life skill)
- Career Counselling  
Will be conducted for students of Std X by One Good Step
- Computer Education  
Will be contingent to computer infrastructure available in the school.
- Value Education  
Currently in an exploratory stage with an NGO partner.
- Maths Education  
Currently in an exploratory stage
- Science Education  
Currently in an exploratory stage.

## Good Step # 89 CTEV footwear for mobility disabled



CTEV or more commonly known as club feet is a congenital defect where the legs are abnormally formed.

While early correction can produce significant results, many families are either unaware or unable to give this treatment to the child. Uncorrected the wearer will eventually require special footwear customized to the feet.

In this pilot effort we provided for this little boy and intend to help other children like him.



The craftsman who makes these is himself differently abled. Determined to be self-sufficient and help others like him he has honed his craft to such an extent that hospitals contact him for their most difficult customized shoes. This effort benefits him and boosts his spirit of self-reliance

## Good Step # 90 Nanna Kannu

“Nanna Kannu” (My Eyes) is a comprehensive, diagnosis-intervention-remedial program, designed to serve the ophthalmic health needs of under-privileged children, who have limited or no access to basic healthcare. The objective is to prevent childhood blindness and progressive vision loss. This is executed through volunteer screening at impoverished government schools.

The program is conducted in collaboration with Sankara Eye Hospital and Samarpan, volunteer group of Infosys, Bangalore DC

This year the school camps were conducted at Yadgir and Gulbarga, despite multiple challenges

- Located in highly remote areas, these districts are quite underdeveloped areas in Karnataka and most lagging on all human development indices. Mobilizing volunteers to give their time to travel this distance and perform the primary screening has been the most significant achievement that was instrumental in the successful execution of the project.
- Grass-roots logistics were challenging as the level of co-operation from local bodies was limited, despite repeated communication from the education department. Intense co-ordination helped to overcome this challenge and cover even the remotest of the widely spread out schools.

Execution was successfully completed despite these challenges through the following five mega-camps

### **First Volunteering Camp at Hunasagi Hobli, Shurpur taluk, Yadgiri district on 20th July 2019**

Reached 49 Schools

- Screened 8,425 Children
- Identified 863 Children with eye abnormalities
- 42 Volunteers participated

**OpenText volunteering at Hegganahalli**

On 8<sup>th</sup> August 2019, 32 volunteers of opentext performed the primary screening at GMHPS and GHS Hegganahalli, putting in over half a day of effort for the cause.

1699 students were screened at these two schools. Of these 443 students were shortlisted for secondary screening.

**36 students were prescribed and given spectacles on-the-spot** during the secondary screening.

**55 students were referred to the base hospital** and were treated by Sankara’s doctors at the hospital.

From the last bench to the first bench, these girls suffered with increasing frustration over their progressive hearing loss. Hearing aids though very sophisticated these days are also expensive and unaffordable for most low income families. This was our first attempt to help such students regain their quality of education and life. The pilot was successful and helped us gain the know-how of helping more such students in the future.

Mobility aids significantly improve the quality of life for patients with spinal cord injuries. For some it means an opportunity to pursue some income generation activities. For all such patients it means reduced dependence on care-givers. This distribution of wheelchairs was done for 15 patients with spinal cord injuries in Chikkaballapura, in association with Gramaantara Trust who helped us identify them and organized the distribution.



## Good Step # 104 Good School Project -Sabala

**Sabala** is a counseling initiative, by highly experienced student counsellor Mamatha R and team, for girls from challenging backgrounds.

Conducted at GHS Peenya, individual and group counselling sessions were undertaken over the year, to help 40+ girls in need of counselling intervention.

These girls have witnessed/experienced poverty, domestic abuse (of parent), sexual abuse, alcoholism, drug abuse and other ills commonly prevalent in urban slums of Peenya.

These sessions were designed to counsel them one-on-one on their individual issues and group sessions on gender roles and rights, menstrual health, sexual abuse and life skills (beyond academics)

40+ girls in their crucial high schools years benefited tremendously from the experience of the counsellor and the knowledge/reassurance derived on various topics that affect their emotional and physical well-being.



Many among them have

shown a keen interest in vocational training following their school years. Some have taken a fresh interest in academics. All girls have indicated that they are more hopeful and confident about their futures and determined to get out of the poverty trap through sincere efforts.

## Good Step #105 Good School Project, Confidence Catalyst

A collaborative initiative with i-point Learning, the program imparts English communication skills and confidence boosting interventions.



This is the third year of operation of this program, thanks to the unwavering support of Bhaskar C N (MD, ipoint) and the determination of Archana Harish (expert trainer resource), to see it through.



Conducted this year for 170+ students of GHS Peenya, the program was well-received and assimilated by these students.

It has been successful in addressing the crucial students' mind-block towards learning the English language and boosted their confidence in attempting to communicate in English. The program has served as a platform on which students can build on, through their own efforts in the future.

### Good Step #107:

### Gift of Vision (GOV) camp at KM Doddi, Mandya

Areas that have limited/no access to healthcare facilities and economically challenged communities see a very high-incidence of cataract related blindness among seniors. Most cases of cataract are easily treatable if detected early and post-operative quality of life and self-reliance greatly improves for such patients. We address these issues through Gift of Vision community camps.

In the community camps, once the patients are diagnosed with cataract, they are screened for medical fitness for undergoing surgery. If found fit they are brought as a group (along with one attender) to the base hospital in Bengaluru. In the hospital they undergo further screening and preparation for surgeries on the following day. All surgeries are performed over the course of a day and patients are taken back to their villages the following day. Follow-up at these locations (on-site) is done after a month, or as and when required by the patients (at the hospital).

Presence of functional computers/computer labs is an essential infrastructure requirement in schools today. Yet most schools are lacking in this facility. Computers are not provided to all schools and wherever present there is no maintenance plan in place. As a result, following small repairs the systems go into disuse.

Our Field Operations Manager, Ronil Periera, (who has worked as a hardware expert in the past), has made a commendable effort to fix systems wherever possible and install new systems where systems are unavailable and guide staff on their use.
